Thua Thien Province – Fire Support Base Helen

Richard John Borovick arrived in Vietnam in August of 1968. He served with Alpha Company, 3/187th. Richard lost his life on January 2, 1969 on the helipad on Fire Support Base Helen when he accidentally walked into a helicopter rotor blade.

Richard was from South Boston, Massachusetts and was twenty-three years of age. He is buried at New Cavalry Cemetery, Mattapan, Massachusetts. His name is etched on the Vietnam Memorial Wall, Panel 35W, Line 019.

February 25, 1969 Clarence Joseph Babin Jr

Operation Spokane Rapids – Thua Thien Province

Clarence Joseph Babin Jr. arrived in Vietnam in October of 1968. He served with Delta Company, 3/187th. Clarence was killed in action on February 26, 1969 while walking point during a combat operation.

Clarence was from Marrero, Louisiana and was twenty-two years of age. He is buried at Westlawn Memorial Park, Gretna, Louisiana. His name is etched on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, Panel 31W, Line 42.

Thomas Michael arrived in Vietnam in August of 1968. He served with Alpha Company, 3/187th. Thomas was wounded in action on March 27, 1969 during the NVA assault on Fire Support Base Jack. He was medevac'd and admitted to a military hospital where he succumbed to his wounds on March 28, 1969.

Thomas Gordon St Onge arrived in Vietnam in November of 1968. He served with Bravo Company, 3/187th. Thomas was killed in action on April 25, 1969, during a combat operation when the helicopter he was in was hit by a RPG and crashed.

Thomas was from Hermansville, Michigan and was twenty years of age. He is buried at Meyer Township Cemetery, Menominee, Michigan. His name is etched on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, Panel 35W, Line 51.

Seth Earl Randolph arrived in Vietnam in January of 1969. He served with Alpha Company, 3/187th. Seth was killed in action on April 26, 1969 during a combat operation on Dong Ngai in the A Shau Valley.

Seth was from Houston, Texas and was twenty-one years of age. He is buried at El Pleasant Cemetery, Wallis, Texas. His name is etched on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, Panel 26W, Line 56.

May 2, 1969 Rolland Keith Fry


Operation Kentucky Jumper/Operation Massachusetts Striker

Rolland Keith Fry arrived in Vietnam in November of 1968. He served with Alpha Company, 3/187th. Rolland was killed in action on May 2, 1969 during a combat operation on Dong Ngai near FSB Airborne. Alpha Company was on patrol when the lead platoon came under fire. Rolland Fry returned fire and was wounded by a **RPG.** Rolland continued to return fire when he was mortally wounded by a second RPG

explosion.

Rolland was from Hutchinson, Kansas and was twenty years of age. He is buried at Memorial Park Cemetery, Hutchinson, Kansas. His name is etched on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, Panel 26W, Line 99.

Operation Kentucky Jumper/Operation Massachusetts Striker

Lemuel Ebb Terrell arrived in Vietnam in August of 1968. He served with Alpha Company, 3/187th. Lemuel was killed in action on May 3, 1969 during a combat operation on Dong Ngai near FSB Airborne. Elements of Alpha Company were on patrol when Lemuel spotted an NVA position to his front. Lemuel was able to warn other members of his platoon and engage the NVA. Lemuel was hit by automatic weapons fire.

Purvis, Mississippi and was nineteen years of age. He is buried at Grantham Cemetery, Lamar County, Mississippi. His name is etched on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall, Panel 26W, Line 109.


August 3, 1969 Phillip Charles Smith
